Biographical note:

Private Amos Brown was wounded during the Battle of Corinth, Mississippi which took place on October 3rd and 4th, 1862. He belonged to Company A, 16th Wisconsin Infantry Volunteers.

COLLECTION OVERVIEW:

Doc.#1 of 1: A letter written by Amos Brown to his sister Miss Nancy Brown while he was hospitalized from wounds received from the Battle of Corinth, Mississippi (October 1 and 2, 1862).

Noteworthy: He mentions that he recognizes ten men from his company that are in the room with him and noting that one had run away since he was admitted. He mentions that a Major thinks the war will be over in 6 months or less.
