Third Cavalry, The Third regiment of Cavalry was organized at Camp Barstow, Janesville, WI, and mustered into the service of the United States at various dates, the muster being completed on January 31, 1862. The regiment left the State on March 26 for St. Louis, MO. On its way there and near Chicago an unfortunate railway accident occurred in which twelve men were killed. The regiment remained at St. Louis until the latter part of May, when it was assigned to Ft. Leavenworth, KS, and here on the 27 of May, Colonel Barstow, the Commander, was appointed Provost Marshal of Kansas, and companies of the Third Cavalry were assigned to provost duty in several localities. In the month of September of that year six companies were detached and assigned to duty under General Salomon in southwestern Missouri and Arkansas, and with the Union forces with this command participated in the battle of Prairie Grove, December 7, 1862. The remainder of the service of this regiment was spent in southwestern Missouri, Arkansas, Kansas and Indian Territory, detachments being almost constantly on the move from point to point, engaged in very arduous duties of scouting, skirmishing and patroling and in frequent contact with the enemy. The regiment was mustered out of the service of the United States by companies the final company being disbanded at Madison, WI, November 1, 1865.

#### Benton Barracks, Missouri

(also known as Camp Benton)

Missouri's largest Civil War Training and Troop Deployment Encampment.

During the Civil War, Benton Barracks, an encampment for Union troops was located in north St. Louis County, 4-5 miles from the City of St. Louis. . "The facility, located on the outskirts of St. Louis, could accommodate 30,000 soldiers and contained a mile of barracks, warehouses, cavalry stables, parade grounds, and a large military hospital. The hospital itself could...serve 2,000 to 3,000 patients."

Benton Barracks was situated on land once owned by John O'Fallon who rented the acreage to U.S. Army, and on the grounds of the old State fairgrounds. This area is now part of the City of St. Louis, in the location of Fairgrounds Park (at Grand Ave. and Natural Bridge Rd.). Camp Benton, which began operations in 1861 had numerous functions: a troop cantonment (replacing Jefferson Barracks after it was converted to a hospital); a parole encampment; a military hospital; and a camp for contraband or refugee slaves. Refugee Unionist (whites) also found sanctuary here. There is also some evidence that a few Confederate guerilla POWs were housed here for a short duration, perhaps awaiting the sentence of execution, in the camp guardhouse.

#### TERRIBLE RAILROAD ACCIDENT.

#### A Train Smashed Up, with the Third Wisconsin Cavalry on Board—Ton Killed and a Number Wounded.

An accident occurred at midnight to the special train from Janesville, with the Third Wisconsin Cavalry aboard, five miles from this city, on the Northwestern Road. The accident was caused by the breaking of an axle of the sixth car, and in the wreck caused by the cars behind this one running into it. Ten soldiers were killed, three seriously wounded, and a number slightly. The names of the killed are:

Waiter Snell, William Case, E. M. Burns, Co. G; Charles Briggs, Lucien M. Rossinau, James F. Pal, mer, Charles D. Hatch, Kasper Stone, William Davis, Co. A; also Hospital-Steward Clark, of Walworth County.

S. J. Edwards, Co. G; ribs broken.

Byron Wilcox, Co. L; both legs broken.

---- Tweedle; internal injuries in the left side.

Col. Banstow says there are about one hundred more or less injured, but able to continue with the regiment.


A.C. Snyder, aged 76 years, 5 months and 26 days died at the home of his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Rose, 704 West Eighth street, yesterday evening at 7:30 o'clock. Mr. Snyder had been afflicted with gall stones for some time, but until recently he has not been seriously ill. He went to Lincoln on August 30 to attend the state fair. He was taken sick on the following day and taken to the St. Elizabeth hospital in that city for treatment. Mr. and Mrs. Rose, who were notified of Mr. Snyder's sickness went to Lincoln and had their father removed to this city. Since that time he had been living at the Rose home and seemed to be recovering his health. Yesterday afternoon, about 4 o'clock he suddenly became seriously ill and passed away at the hour above mentioned. On account of the suddenness of the final attack, Mr. and Mrs. Rose were the only relatives present at the time of death. A.C. Snyder was born in Anida county, New York, March 27, 1837, and at the age of 18 years moved to the state of Michigan. At the age of 24 years he enlisted in the Third Wisconsin cavalry and served through the civil war. He came to Nebraska in the year 1880, and for the past twenty-seven years had made his home at St. Paul. He was a successful farmer, and during the latter years of his life had lived a retired life. He leaves to mourn his loss, his wife, six sons, five daughters, a brother and a sister. All of the children live in this state with the exception of one at Sterling, Colo., and one at Seattle, Wash. The brother and sister reside at the old home in Anida county, New York. All the children, except the one at Seattle will be present at the funeral, which will take place at 1 o'clock Thursday afternoon from the house, 704 West Eighth street, and at 1:30 at the Presbyterian church on West Second street. Rev. Ernst will officiate at the funeral services.




Abraham's Bugle




ZINSIDE LIP OF BUGLE




