# Biographical note:

From State of Wisconsin Muster Rolls: Adam Jungbluth was born in Germany on August 31, 1828 in Undenheim, Hesse-Darmstadt, Germany to Heinrich Jungbluth (1798-1869) and Maria Catharina Ahr Jungbluth48 (1800-1872). At some point either Adam or possibly his parents changed their name to Youngblood as a U.S. Citizen much later in life. Adam listed his occupation in Menominee Township (Waukesha County, Wisconsin) as a farmer. He married Christine Becker on February 12, 1854 in Germantown, Washington County, Wisconsin. Witnesses to their marriage were Peter Becker and Heinrich Jungbluth. They had a total of 13 children, Dorothea, Heinrich, Cardine, Adam, Jno, Friedrich, Peter, Christina, Lydia, George, Henrietta, Sophia M. and Gustav A. Adam Youngbood was drafted in Menominee and enlisted in the Union Army for a 1 year term on December 1, 1864. He was 33 years old at the time of his enlistment and had gray eyes. His actual length of service was 6 months and 14 days achieving the rank of Private. He died on March 19, 1882 (location of burial site and state not mentioned).

# COLLECTION OVERVIEW

As previously mentioned, the 5 documents listed below are an indication of his dates of service and physical appearance.

- Doc. #1 of 5: This information from a Muster Roll is already explained in full the above Biographical Note but adds that Pvt. Youngblood's complexion was dark and that his height was listed as 5 feet, 3 and 1/4<sup>th</sup> inches tall. No date given for this document.
- Doc. #2 of 5: Muster Roll dated July 14, 1865, Louisville, Kentucky. Was last paid to April 30, 1865 in which \$48 was drawn.
- Doc. #3 of 5: Adam Youngblood is identified as a Private belonging to Company G for MCH and \_\_\_\_\_\_1865, present. From the Second Auditors Roll.
- Doc. #4 of 5: Adam Youngblood, Private, Company G, 17<sup>th</sup> Regiment Wisconsin marked PRESENT from January to February, 1865 Reanks Ret., Drafted, Joined the Company C at Pocotaligo, January 28, 1865.

Doc. #5 of 5: Adam Youngblood, Private, for the 17<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Wisconsin Infantry, was drafted in Madison, Wisconsin on December 26, 1864.
Born in Germany, age 38 years, occupation listed as a farmer.
Enlisted in Menominee for 1 year.
Eyes-Grey, Hair-Black, Dark Complexion, 5 feet 3 and 3/4<sup>th</sup> inches tall.
Mustered in on December 1, 1864 at Dirk, Wisconsin.
