Vols. In the war of 1862-65 who at battle of Kenesaw Mountain Ga in June or July 1864 incurred varicose veins of left leg; Also at battle of Franklin Tenn. Dec 17, 1864 received bayonet wound in action over left eye causing loss of sight of said eye and finally resulting in his death on the 8th day of December A.D. 1887 who bore at the time of his discharge the rank of private in the aforesaid service that she was married under the name of Margaret E. Staley to said George Winkle on the 23d day of February A.D. 1868 by H.K. Ritter J. P. at Austin Twp, Cass Co there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that neither she nor her husband had been previously married had not been previously married but she had been married to Samuel Staley who is dead.
