

The Civil War Diary of Louis J. Lamson

Corporal Company A 30th Wisconsin Infantry

FROM JANUARY 1, 1863 TO DECEMBER 31, 1863

LOUIS LAMSON FARMED NEAR ROBERTS, TOWN OF WARREN, ST. CROIX COUNTY, WISCONSIN FOR MUCH OF HIS LIFE. HE SERVED FOR THREE YEARS WITH THE 30TH WISCONSIN DOING DRAFT DUTY, RIOT CONTROL PRIMARILY IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN. THE UNIT DID SERVE NEAR NASHVILLE AT THE END OF THE CIVIL WAR.

CAPTAIN SAMUEL HARRIMAN OF COMPANY A AND SOMERSET, WISCONSIN LATER BECAME COLONEL OF THE 37TH WISCONSIN AND FOUGHT AT THE CRATER.

THE ORIGINAL OF THE DIARY WAS STORED AT THE ST. CROIX COUNTY, WISCONSIN HISTORICAL SOCIETY AT HUDSON, WI. I SPENT A WEEK THERE IN 1990 COPYING THE JOURNAL WHICH IS PRESENTED HERE.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 1, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

WELCOME TO THE NEW YEAR. MAY THY NUMBER OF DAYS CAUSE OUR WHOLE PEOPLE TO REJOICE OVER THEIR ENEMIES. ALSO MAY THOSE WHO ARE AWAY FROM THEIR FAMILIES COME HOME SAFELY. HAD AN EXCELLENT DINNER AT THE BARRACKS IN CAMP RANDALL. HAD NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS IN BAYONET EXERCISES TODAY GIVEN BY LT. (HENRY A.) WILSON (CO. A). DISTRIBUTED THE COMPANY MAIL TODAY.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 2, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

A VERY RAINY DAY, GIVING THE BOYS A GOOD CHANCE TO SHOW OFF THEIR LAZINESS. READING, WRITING AND SLEEPING SEEM TO BE THE ORDER OF THE DAY. ACTED AS WOOD SUPERINTENDENT IN PLACE OF SGT. (JAMES W.) DEAN.(CO. A). MUD GETTING TO BE AWFUL THICK AND DEEP. DISTRIBUTED THE COMPANY MAIL IN THE FORENOON. WROTE A LETTER TO MARY (LAMSON).

SATURDAY, JANUARY 3, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

WAS SUPERNUMERARY CORPORAL OF THE GUARD. THE OFFICER IS LT. (SAMUEL W.) SMITH.(CO. E).THE MUD DRYING UP VERY FAST. LETTER FROM MARY (LAMSON), BEACH SANFORD AND OLIVER SANFORD. WEATHER FINE AND WARM, ALMOST LIKE SUMMER TIME. ABOUT THIRTY MEN IN THE COMPANY ARE SICK.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 4, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

A SPLENDID DAY WITH WARM SUNSHINE, ALMOST LIKE THAT OF SUMMER. WENT OUT ON COMPANY INSPECTION AT HALF PAST NINE. COMPANY PASSED FINELY. WROTE A LETTER TO MARY (LAMSON). RECEIVED A LETTER FROM GEORGE FRISSELL DATED HUDSON, WIS.

MONDAY, JANUARY 5, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

WENT DOWN TO THE CITY OF MADISON FOR THE PURPOSE OF GETTING SOME BLANKS TO SEND TO MATTIE (LAMSON). A SENTINEL SHOT AT PRISONER IN THE GUARD HOUSE FOR INSULTING HIM. A LIGHT FALL OF SNOW. TWO MEN DIED IN THE HOSPITAL. SENT THE BLANKS TO MATTIE FOR THE \$15.00 PER MONTH AND ALSO A LETTER TO MARY.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 6, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

COMPANY DRILL IN THE FORENOON. IN THE AFTERNOON COMPANY DRILL WITH KNAPSACKS. TWO MEN DIED LAST NIGHT AT THE HOSPITAL AND WERE REMOVED FROM CAMP TODAY.(DAVID S.) CHAMBERS (CO. A) CONSIDERED VERY SICK. SGT. (GEORGE) MARTIN (CO A) IS GETTING TO BE QUITE SMART. WEATHER PRETTY COLD. RECEIVED 2 LETTERS FROM MATTIE LAMSON.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 7, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

A FINE COLD DAY SUCH AS I USED TO ENJOY UP IN ST. CROIX COUNTY. JUST COLD ENOUGH TO BE COMFORTABLE BEING OUT. NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICER DRILL IN THE FORENOON GIVEN BY LT. WILSON. SKIRMISH DRILL IN THE AFTERNOON. SENT A PAIR OF DRAWERS AWAY TO HAVE THEM WASHED, MARKED BY A WHITE WOOLLEN THREAD BEING RUN INTO THE BACK PART OF THE WAISTBAND.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 8, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)

BATTALION DRILL IN THE FORENOON AND SKIRMISH DRILL IN THE PM. WEATHER STILL OPEN WITH NO SNOW. GROUND FROZEN. CONSIDERABLE SICKNESS IN CAMP. COMMENCED LETTER TO MARY (LAMSON).

FRIDAY, JANUARY 9, 1863

PIES .15
(CAMP RANDALL)
(IN BLACK BORDER) DAVID S. CHAMBERS DIED AT HALF PAST ONE O'CLOCK THIS MORNING. (CHAMBERS, A HUDSON, WI. MERCHANT, DIED OF TYPHOID. HE ENLISTED IN HUDSON 8-11-1862 AND WAS A WAGONER. BATTALION DRILL IN THE FORENOON. WEATHER STILL PLEASANT WITH NO SNOW.
RECEIVED 2 LETTERS FROM MARY (LAMSON).
WENT DOWN TO MADISON IN THE EVENING.
BILLIARDS .30
DO FOR W. (WILLIAM) J. EGBERT (CO. A) .30
OLIVER SANFORD CAME INTO CAMP WHILE I WAS GONE TO MADISON. LETTERS TO MARY (LAMSON) ADDRESSED TO MILFORDTON, OHIO.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 10, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)
WAS SUPERNUMERARY OF THE GUARD. GOT RELEASED IN THE FORENOON TO COME AND SEE COUSIN OLIVER SANFORD.
WENT AROUND AND NAILED UP THE FENCE IN THE AFTERNOON.
OLIVER WENT WITH ME.
PAPER .15
CIGAR .15

SUNDAY, JANUARY 11, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)
INSPECTION OF ARMS AND KNAPSACKS IN THE MORNING.
ATTENDED THE FUNERAL OF OUR DEAR SOLDIER BROTHER, DAVID S. CHAMBERS (PVT.). COMPANIES A AND D WERE BOTH OUT (BOTH CO. A AND CO. D. OF THE 30TH WI. WERE RECRUITED IN ST. CROIX COUNTY). PRESENTATION OF FLAGS ON DRESS PARADE, ESCORTED BY CO. A. SENT LETTER TO MARY (LAMSON).
WEATHER QUITE PLEASANT. CLEAR IN THE FORENOON, CLOUDY IN THE AFTERNOON.

MONDAY, JANUARY 12, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)
A VERY PLEASANT DAY WITH SUNSHINE. HAVE GOT A WRETCHED COLD. TOOK A GENERAL WASH.
BATTALION DRILL IN THE FORENOON.
WROTE A LETTER TO MARY (LAMSON) DIRECTED TO MILFORDTON, OH.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 13, 1863

(CAMP RANDALL)
42 MEN LEFT CAMP RANDALL IN THE RAIN, BOUND FOR DARLINGTON (WI.). WE STARTED FROM CAMP BEFORE DAYLIGHT AND OUR COMPANY MARCHED IN THE RAIN AND SLEET.
LEFT MADISON AT 8 O'CLOCK AM. TOOK THE TRAIN FOR ARENA, (WI.) A DISTANCE OF THIRTY MILES. ARRIVED AT ARENA AT HALF PAST 10. GOT OUR DINNERS AND STARTED OUT ON FOOT FOR THE RUGGLES FARM A DISTANCE OF 15 MILES (or 12 miles. See entry 1-26-63) ARRIVED THERE A LITTLE BEFORE DUSK. FOUND THE BEST OF PEOPLE THERE. SLEPT IN A BARN 15 FEET LONG. WAS NEARLY LAID UP WITH A COLD. WEATHER COLDER IN THE AFTERNOON.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 14, 1863

(RUGGLES FARM)
GOT UP THIS MORNING FEELING A LITTLE BETTER. HAD SOME BUTTER AND POTATOES FOR BREAKFAST.
STARTED FOR MINERAL POINT (WI.). ARRIVED AT DODGEVILLE (WI.) A LITTLE AFTER NOON.
STARTED FROM DODGEVILLE AT 3.00 O'CLOCK AND ARRIVED AT MINERAL POINT A LITTLE AFTER DARK. DISTANCE FROM RUGGLES TO MINERAL POINT 22 (?) MILES. HAD A POOR DAY OF IT. RODE ON THE WAGON PART OF THE WAY. PUT UP AT THE OLD COURT HOUSE. POPULATION OF MINERAL POINT 2,500.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 15, 1863

(MINERAL POINT)
LEFT MINERAL POINT ABOUT 1 O'CLOCK (PM) BOUND FOR DARLINGTON, (WI.), DISTANCE 22 MILES. THE COUNTRY OVER WHICH WE TRAVELLED WAS ROLLING AND BETTER MINING COUNTRY THAN FARMING. THE FACE OF THE COUNTRY THROUGH PORTIONS OF OUR ROUTE WAS ENTIRELY DUG OVER FOR MINERALS.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 16, 1863

(DARLINGTON)
CAME FROM DARLINGTON THROUGH TO SHULLSBURG (WI.). ARRIVED THIS PLACE AT ABOUT HALF PAST 4 O'CLOCK (PM). LEFT THREE SICK AT DARLINGTON; CHARLES COOK (ALDEN), WILLIAM HALL (TRIMBELLE) AND SGT. (ELLSWORTH) BURNETT (RIVER FALLS AND ALL OF CO. A.). I WALKED ALL OF THE DISTANCE TODAY FEELING CONSIDERABLE BETTER THAN ON YESTERDAY.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 17, 1863

(SHULLSBURG)
VISITING WITH THE GOOD PEOPLE OF SHULLSBURG WHO TREAT US TO GOOD MEALS, GOOD BEDS AND KIND TALK. RATHER COLD FOR SUMMER, WHICH FROM THE APPEARANCE OF THE WEATHER, WAS INTENDED FOR THAT GENTLE SEASON. WILL EGBERT (HAMMOND) AND I WENT TO MR. BRENNAN'S (?) AND STAYED THERE OVER NIGHT. A DAUGHTER, A WIDOW NAMED REED WAS THERE WITH A LITTLE INFANT 4 OR 5 MONTHS OLD.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 18, 1863

(SHULLSBURG)
A SPLENDID DAY. WENT TO CHURCH IN THE FORENOON. PEOPLE IN THIS PLACE ARE VERY KIND TO THE SOLDIERS. MR. TOWNSEND SENT A LOT OF GOOD THINGS FOR THE BOYS. WROTE LETTERS TO MARY (LAMSON) AND FATHER SANFORD.

MONDAY, JANUARY 19, 1863

(SHULLSBURG)
PICKED UP KNAPSACKS PREPARING FOR A MARCH TO BENTON (WI.). STARTED ABOUT 10 O'CLOCK (AM). WENT OUT IN SIGHT OF DP?, WHERE I WITH TWO OTHER MEN WENT OUT IN SEARCH OF A DRAFTED PERSON. WENT ON TO BENTON AND FROM THERE TO MR. GILBERT'S (?), THREE & 1/2 MILES FROM BENTON. THE WHOLE SEARCH WAS OF NO AVAIL. QUITE A LITTLE SNOW STORM OCCURRED.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 20, 1863

(BENTON)
AROSE FROM MY BED IN THE HAY-MOW FEELING SOME BETTER. BREAKFAST, AND THE BOYS WERE SHOWN THE WAY TO THE HOUSE WHERE THEY WERE FREELY TREATED TO CURRANT WINE. MARCHED TO NEW DIGGINGS, (WI.). ARRIVED THERE AT 1 O'CLOCK (PM), WHERE WE GOT ONE AMOS BROWN (AMOS H. BROWN LATER OF CO C, 50TH WI INF.). STOPPED AT MR. CHAMPION, A WEALTHY MINER AND GOT A LITTLE REST. IN THE AFTERNOON WE MARCHED BACK TO SHULLSBURG.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 21, 1863

(SHULLSBURG)
AT THE PLEASANT VILLAGE OF SHULLSBURG. SPENDING A GOOD DAY OF PLEASURE WITH OUR GOOD NEIGHBOURS, EATING OFF THE FAT OF THE LAND. BY SPECIAL INVITATION FROM MR. WEATHERBY, A WELL-TO-DO MINER, WE WENT TO DINNER. THE CAPTAIN (SAMUEL HARRIMAN OF SOMERSET), THE LIEUTENANT (HENRY WILSON) HUDSON) AND ELEVEN OTHERS MYSELF INCLUDED. WE FOUND OURSELVES, AFTER A SHORT WALK, NICELY SEATED IN THE OFFICE OF OUR WORTHY HOST, SMOKING CIGARS. THEN CAME A DINNER SUCH AS I NEVER EXPECT TO PARTAKE OF AGAIN UNTIL I REACH MY NATIVE HOME. AFTER DINNING WE HAD MUSIC ON THE PIANO. AFTER THAT ANOTHER SMOKE.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 22, 1863

(SHULLSBURG)
AFTER PACKING KNAPSACKS, ORDERS TO MARCH WERE GIVEN. CONSEQUENTLY WE ALL SET OUT FOR DARLINGTON, EXCEPTING TWO; (EDWARD S.) HARMER (HUDSON) AND (ISRAEL) CHILDS (RIVER FALLS), CHILDS BEING SICK. HARMER WAS LEFT TO CARE FOR HIM. AROUND HALF PAST TWELVE, NOON FOUND THE BOYS WHO WERE LEFT BEHIND SICK (COOK, HALL AND BURNETT) GETTING MUCH BETTER. RECEIVED NEWS OF SGT. (GEORGE) MARTIN'S (RIVER FALLS) DEATH (OF DISEASE AT MADISON 1-15-1863). ARRIVED AT DARLINGTON AT 2 O'CLOCK (PM). WAITED FOR THE TRAIN UNTIL HALF PAST 8. ARRIVED AT MINERAL POINT AT HALF PAST 9. LETTER TO MARY (LAMSON).

FRIDAY, JANUARY 23, 1863 (MINERAL POINT)
A RAINY DAY, SPENT IN IDLENESS ABOUT TOWN.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 24, 1863 (MINERAL POINT)
STILL AT MINERAL POINT. SNOWED A LITTLE LAST NIGHT.
SEVERAL GUARDS WERE SENT OUT IN DIFFERENT DIRECTIONS, BUT I
WAS PERMITTED TO REMAIN AT THE QUARTERS.
WEATHER QUITE FAIR AND NOT VERY COLD.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 25, 1863 (MINERAL POINT)
LEFT MINERAL POINT AT HALF PAST 7 O'CLOCK (AM) BOUND FOR MR.
RUGGLES (FARM), A DISTANCE OF 22 MILES. STARTED A ONE HALF PAST
7 O'CLOCK. ARRIVED IN DODGEVILLE AT 20 MINUTES TO 10 AND
REACHED RUGGLES AT HALF PAST 1 (PM).
LOST OUR GUNS BY PUTTING THEM IN A LITTLE WAGON. MOSES
(GOODNOE OF WARREN) AND 2 OTHERS WENT BACK ON HORSEBACK
AND GOT THEM. QUITE WARM WITH A GOOD LOT OF MUD.
SENT A LETTER TO MARY BY LT. (HENRY A.) WILSON.

MONDAY, JANUARY 26, 1863 (RUGGLES FARM)
WEATHER A LITTLE COLDER THAN USUAL. DID NOT THAW ANY
TODAY. TRAVELLED FROM RUGGLES TO ARENA, A DISTANCE OF 12 MILES.
I WALKED ABOUT 4 MILES, THEN GOT A CHANCE TO RIDE THE
BALANCE OF THE WAY. ARRIVED IN ARENA AT HALF PAST 10. SAID
TOWN IS SITUATED ON THE WISCONSIN RIVER ON BAD (?), SANDY SOIL.
THREE LETTERS FROM MARY (LAMSON).
NUMBER 1 LETTER FROM BROTHER ALVIN LAMSON, WRITTEN AT
COVINGTON, KENTUCKY, SEPTEMBER 27, 1862.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 27, 1863 (ARENA)
STARTED FROM ARENA ON THE 9 O'CLOCK (AM) TRAIN FOR CAMP
RANDALL. ARRIVED IN CAMP AT 12 NOON.
ATE THE BEST DINNER THAT OUR BOYS EVER GOT UP.
FOUND OLIVER (SANFORD OF WARREN) DOWN WITH THE MEASLES AND
AS RED AS HE COULD BE. WILLIAM EGBERT (HAMMOND) AND I WENT
DOWN TO MADISON TONIGHT AND PLAYED 2 AND 1/2 STRINGS OF
BILLIARDS. I PAID THE BILL. .52 CENTS.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 28, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
TOOK A GENERAL GOOD WASH ALL OVER AND CHANGED MY CLOTHES.
A LETTER FROM MARY (LAMSON) WHICH CONTAINED ONE FOR OLIVER
(SANFORD). SENT A LETTER FOR FATHER SANFORD.
BATTALION DRILL IN THE FORENOON, COMPANY DRILL IN THE
AFTERNOON. WE FARE A GREAT DEAL BETTER THAN WHEN WE WENT
AWAY FROM THIS PLACE.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 29, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
A LONG BATTALION DRILL IN THE FORENOON. CAPTAIN (SAMUEL)
HARRIMAN ACTED AS THE LT. COL.
SKIRMISH DRILL IN THE AFTERNOON. SAT UP FROM ONE TO THREE
WITH OLIVER SANFORD. A LITTLE SNOW, SOME WIND AND SQUALLS.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 30, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
SAT UP IN THE HOSPITAL FROM 12 MIDNIGHT TO 6 AM. AARON PHILLIPS
(NEW RICHMOND) IS PRETTY SICK. OLIVER APPEARS TO BE GAINING
SLOWLY. LAID AND SLEPT UNTIL 11 O'CLOCK (AM). WAS ON SKIRMISH
DRILL IN THE AFTERNOON WEATHER MODERATELY FAIR.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 31, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
TIMES IN CAMP EXTREMELY DULL. NO NEWS FROM ANYBODY.
BATTALION DRILL AS USUAL. THE SICK FROM COMPANY A ARE ALL
GETTING WELL. OLIVER (SANFORD) RECEIVED A LETTER FROM HOME.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
A LITTLE COLDER THAN USUAL WITH A STRONG SOUTHWEST WIND.
INSPECTION OF COMPANY IN THE MORNING

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 1863 BOUGHT 12 SHEETS OF LETTER PAPER, .10 AND 8 CAKES, .08.
(CAMP RANDALL)
NOTHING OF IMPORTANCE TODAY. PERFORMED THE USUAL DRILLS.
WEATHER VERY FAIR BUT COOL TOWARD EVENING.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 3, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
PRETTY COLD. THE COLDEST DAY OF THE WINTER SO FAR.
I RECEIVED A LETTER FROM HENRY FARNAM (HARRY J. FARNAM, CO. G,
4TH WI. INF./CAV. FROM HUDSON) DATED AT CAMP PARAPET, NEW
ORLEANS, LOUISIANA.
SAT UP WITH SICK IN THE QUARTERS UNTIL MIDNIGHT.
2 LETTERS FROM MARY (LAMSON), ONE DIRECTED TO DARLINGTON.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
A SNOWING, BLUSTERING DAY AND MIDDLING COLD.
READING MATTIE'S LETTERS AND WRITING TO HER.
DRAWE (SIC) ONE PAIR OF PANTS.
WROTE A LETTER TO MARY.
COMPANIES A AND D WENT DOWN TO MADISON TO QUELL A RIOT
OCCASIONED BY A SHOOTING AFFRAY

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 5, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
WEATHER PRETTY COLD, SO COLD THERE WAS NO DRILL.
RECEIVED A LETTER FROM MARY, WRITTEN ON THE 26TH AND MAILED
ON THE 28TH.
DRESS PARADE. FIVE COURT MARTIALS ANNOUNCED.

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
A PLEASANT MORNING. GOT MY CLEAN CLOTHES FROM THE WASHER
WOMAN. BATTALION AND COMPANY DRILL. WEATHER RATHER
PLEASANT.
RECEIVED A LETTER FROM MARY STATING JESSE WAS PRETTY SICK.

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
A BATTALION DRILL IN THE FORENOON. IN THE AFTERNOON WE WERE
MARCHED DOWN TO MADISON, BOTH THE 25TH AND 30TH REGIMENTS,
TO PASS IN REVIEW BEFORE THE GOVERNOR, GOVERNOR SALOMON.
THE WEATHER IS EXTREMELY DELIGHTFUL, WITH NOT MUCH SNOW.
THE GROUND IS ALMOST BARE.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
COLD AND WINDY, BLUSTERING, WITH GALES OF WIND BUT VERY
LITTLE SNOW. I WAS SERGEANT OF THE GUARD. PASSED ABOUT A
THOUSAND MEN OUT TO GO TO THE CHURCH. NUMBER OF MEN FOR
THE GUARD; 90. 30 ON EACH SHIFT.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
LAID ABED AND PLAYED CHESS. A STORMY DAY. SNOW THEN WIND
BLOWS IT ALL AWAY. SENT A LETTER TO MARY LAMSON.

RECEIVED \$19.00 OF GOVERNMENT PAY AND ONE LETTER FROM MARY.

GOT BOOTS FIXED .70
OYSTERS AND CIGARS .30
BILLIARDS .20

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
VERY DISAGREEABLE WEATHER, WITH ANY AMOUNT OF MUD.
RECEIVED .60 CENTS OF ODD CHANGE FROM CAPTAIN (SAMUEL)
HARRIMAN AS GOVERNMENT PAY.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)
A VERY DISAGREEABLE MORNING. CLOUDY OVER HEAD AND MUDDY UNDER FOOT.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 1863 (CAMP RANDALL)

44TH WISCONSIN INFANTRY REGIMENT

THIS REGIMENT MUSTERED INTO FEDERAL SERVICE AT CAMP RANDALL, MADISON, WISCONSIN ON SEPTEMBER 27TH, 1864. ALL ENLISTMENTS WERE FOR ONE YEAR. THE UNIT WAS OFFICIALLY COMPLETED FEBRUARY 15, 1865.

THE COMPLETED COMPANIES FORMED A BATTALION INCLUDING COMPANY A, THEY WERE RUSHED TO NASHVILLE IN THE FALL OF 1864 TO ACT AS RESERVE FOR UNION GENERAL GEORGE HENRY THOMAS, "THE ROCK OF CHICKAMAUGA".

DURING THE BATTLE OF NASHVILLE, DECEMBER 15 AND 16TH, COMPANY A OCCUPIED TRENCHES BETWEEN FORT NAGLEY AND THE FRANKLIN PIKE. THIS WAS PART OF AN INTERIOR LINE SOUTH OF THE CUMBERLAND RIVER SURROUNDING NASHVILLE TO THE SOUTH FORT NEGLEY WAS JUST SOUTH EAST OF NASHVILLE PROPER AND THE FRANKLIN PIKE ENTERED NASHVILLE FROM THE SOUTH. THE TRENCHES WERE COLD AND WET AND THE DEATH RATE FROM PNEUMONIA WAS FAIRLY HIGH BUT THE REBELS DID NOT QUITE REACH THE INTERIOR LINE OF DEFENCE..

AFTER THE BATTLE THE COMPANY SAW SERVICE AT EASTPORT, MISSISSIPPI AND PADUCAH, KENTUCKY. THEY WERE EMPLOYED ON PICKET DUTY. SOME OF THE COMPANY WAS MUSTERED OUT ON JULY 2, 1865 AT PADUCAH, KY. THOSE ENTERING LATER WERE WITH THE UNIT UNTIL IT WAS MUSTERED OUT ON AUGUST 28, 1865. THE REMAINDER OF THE REGIMENT WAS PAID OFF IN MADISON, WI. SEPTEMBER 2, 1865.

THE ORIGINAL REGIMENTAL STRENGTH WAS 877. AN ADDITIONAL 237 WERE ADDED AS RECRUITS IN FEBRUARY OF 1865 AND MADE A TOTAL REGIMENTAL STRENGTH OF 1,114. THERE WERE NO BATTLE DEATHS, THOUGH 60 DIED OF DISEASE . ONE DIED OF ACCIDENTLY. THE DEATH RATE IN THIS REGIMENT WAS 5/475

MANY WERE DISCHARGED BECAUSE OF ILLNESS AND SUFFERED THE EFFECTS OF THE WINTER CAMPAIGN IN FRONT OF NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE THE REST OF THEIR LIVES.
