### **Abstract**

The Oscar Carlson Collection is a packet of materials concerning the story of Oscar Carlson, a volunteer with the 28<sup>th</sup> Wisconsin during the Civil War. He served during the draft riots in Port Washington, and also served in Arkansas, Louisiana, and Alabama during the course of the war. After the war he was licensed as a physician in Wisconsin and became the President of the Medical Society of Wisconsin. The collection includes the roster of the 28<sup>th</sup> Wisconsin, a description of and Order of Battle for Helena, Arkansas, and several photographic reproductions of G.A.R. reunions.
