Abstract

This activated collection of 3 diaries that Robert Sidney Merrill wrote chronicling his service from 1863 to 1865 in the 1 st Wisconsin Cavalry regiment. Diaries contain hand drawn maps of Pursuit of Forrest, April 1865, Sherman's March 1864 and Sketch of 1st Brig HQ 1865. Pictures of Pvt Merrill, Generals Edward McCook and James Wilson. Diaries contain 251 pages including glossary and index.

Robert Merrill was born in Union, New York, October 31, 1842. Family moved to Wisconsin in 1854. Enlisted in Beaver Dam. Discharged June 19, 1865 in Nashville, Tennessee. Graduated from The Northwestern Agricultural mechanical Association in dubuque, Iowa, September 1878. Listed occupation as artist, photographer and painter. He died on June 8, 1924 in Minneapolis, Minnesota.
