I, William H Lambertson, born in Oneida Co in the State of New York aged 21 and by occupation a Farmer Do HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE to have volunteered this 10th day of Nov 1862, to serve as a

Soldier in the Army of the United States of America, for the period of THREE Years, unless sooner discharged by proper authority; Do also agree to accept such bounty, pay, rations, and clothing, as are, or may be, established by law for volunteers. And I, William H Lambertson, do solemnly swear, that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, and that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their enemies or opposers whomsoever; and that I will observe and obey the orders of the President of the United States, and the orders of the Officers appointed over me, according to the Rules and Articles of War.

Sworn and subscribed to, at Milwaukee this 10th day of Nov 1862

The Wisconsin "military agent" at Washington telegraphs to Gov. Lewis confirming the death of Col. Haskell Lieuts. Lambertson and Newton, of the 36th regiment, are also killed. The body of Col. Haskell is on the way to Portage City. Col. Mansfield and Maj. Parsons of the 2d regiment, though wounded, are doing well in the rebel hospital at Gordonsville.

The 15th (Norwegian) regiment lost heavily in a battle near Dallas, Georgia, on the 27th. Lieut. Nelson was wounded, and Lieuts. Simonson and Errickson are missing. The total loss was 22 men, being 45 per cent. of the command.

On the 26th the 14th regiment was on the way from Vicksburg to Huntsville. It had been engaged in seven skirmishes, but its losses had been comparatively light.
